Euro-cylinder locks

Euro-cylinder locks are present on the majority of UPVC doors and we are aware that some offenders have developed a method of overcoming them to then gain access into a home. This type of burglary accounts for approximately 20-25% of all burglaries in West Yorkshire. However, in 40% of these offences the offender does not gain full entry to the property and their attempt fails.

West Yorkshire Police have led on this issue nationally and have worked with ACPO Secured by Design and trade authorities such as the British Standards Institute to positively address this matter. Other organisations such as the Door & Hardware Federation, and the Master Locksmiths Association have been instrumental in developing testing process and solutions to this matter.

It is said that the outcome of our proactive approach and such collaboration has resulted in the UK having the most stringent testing processes for euro-cylinder locks in Europe,

if not beyond. There are now two nationally recognised standards for euro-cylinder locks - TS 007 and the Sold Secure Diamond Standard (SS312). Locks achieving either of these two standards have been tested to a higher level and in the same way that an offender may test them in reality. TS 007 is accompanied by a star rating system and cylinders can either achieve a 1 or 3 star rating, 3 stars providing the higher level of protection. Door handles are also tested to TS 007 standards and can achieve a 2 star rating. Therefore, fitting a 3 star cylinder and a 2 star handle enables the maximum level of security provided by the TS 007 testing process (5 stars). The minimum level of security you should look to achieve is 3 stars, which could either be done by fitting a 3 star cylinder on its own or by fitting a 1 star cylinder in combination with a 2 star handle. A 3 star cylinder is the preferred option given it provides the maximum level of security for a lock under the TS 007 testing process.

SAFETY AD

TOP 5 TIPS:

1. Look to upgrade your euro-cylinder locks if they have not achieved a 3 star rating under the TS 007 testing process or the Sold Secure Diamond Standard (SS312)

2. Enhanced security handles achieving a 2 star rating under TS 007 should also be considered

3. Euro-cylinder locks can be changed by yourself, but you will need to measure them properly to ensure they are the right size for your door. They should not be fitted so that they are left protruding from the door unit or handle

4. If you are going to ask someone to upgrade your locks for you consider using the Master Locksmiths Association or a reputable security company. Obtain 3 quotes for the fitting of new locks to the standards referenced above and pick the one that best suits your

circumstances

5. You may also be able to fit sash jammers to your doors, which have been proven to prevent burglaries

Example of a TS007 3 Star Europrofile lock

Euro Cylinder lock advice

All recommended Euro profile locks should be TS 007, 3 star Sold Secure Diamond Standard (SS312) accreditation. They should be snap safe or snap resistant.

HOW TO REPLACE YOUR CYLINDER (IN 5 MINUTES)

■ Unscrew and remove the fixing screw, this is located halfway up the main lock strip on the inside edge of the door, in line with the bottom of the euro cylinder.

- Put the key in one side (use your right hand).
- Put pressure on the other key hole (with your left index finger)

Turn the key one way and if the cylinder does not come straight out turn the key the other way, the cylinder should slide out.

Measure first part of lock section A from the first section of the lock to the hole and then the same for section B again from the hole to the end of the lock. (35mm/45mm)

Purchase the correct size for your door making the lock flush with the face of the handle cover.

Put the new keys into the new cylinder, turn the key until the black cam is facing down then slide the cylinder into position

- Check the door lock operation to make sure of correct fitting.


The Carnival project is seen as a "MODEL OF GOOD PRACTICE" in the UK.

Majorettes has been a massive part of all our lives, it has been an activity that most us instantly fell in love with. Being a part of this group from a young age has shaped our childhoods and has given us a valued set of social skills that we have been able to use in adult lives. Back in 1993 when our Huddersfield Crusaders were first formed, baton twirling was something that we didn't see at all in our deprived area Brackenhall as there wasn't any other activities on offer. A group of us (some who are still involved in the troupe now) became members at the ages of between 8-11 years old and we never looked back!! Sophie Simpson, Sarriah Simpson, Kathryn Cuniffe + Shelley Mclachlan are the only 4 who have danced from the start until now and the nice thing is that Sarriah and Kathryn have been able to watch their daughters (who are now members) dance and compete with the troupe.

Huddersfield Crusaders first took part in the Yorkshire Carnival Association Universal Championships held at The Royal Spa, Bridlington in 1994 – we didn't come home with anything but the officials at the competition recognised that we were going to be a troupe with masses of potential. 3 years later at the age of 13 Sophie became the

head trainer of the troupe and this was the start of something special. With her knowledge of dance and the unique way that she combined it with baton twirling the troupe began to win awards!! In 2000 we got 2 of the top awards at the Universal Championships and from then they kept coming. From 2000 to present Huddersfield Crusaders have been crowned YCA Universal Champions over 10 times in various sections including Junior Dance Twirl, Junior Military Freestyle, Senior Dance Twirl and Senior Open Themed. Most recently our mini Crusaders are making their mark within Great Britain Baton Twirling Association and Northern Maiorette Association having been placed first in Tinies + Juniors this year. The girls have also won Entertaining Performance. Most Most Improved and Best Sections of the day at Yorkshire Carnival Association competitions.

Initially based at Brackenhall Community Centre the Huddersfield Crusaders have had many members from the local community join the troupe over the years, as it is run on a non-profit basis it has always been a way to provide a low-cost activity for young people so that they can be active and to keep them occupied from hanging on the streets. The group is open to both girls and boys who have an interest in dance or who just want to try something new, subs are £2 for 1.5 hour/2 -hour training sessions – Wednesday troupe training sessions are now held at Northfield Hall.



Over the 25 that Huddersfield years Crusaders Majorettes have been а community group there has been so many amazing experiences that the group have been invited to get involved with... In 2004 the senior team of the troupe were invited to dance at Victoria Tower Gardens in London and then taken to the House of Commons with Stacey Rodgers and the charity CO-Gas Safety as part of their 10th anniversary and to to Carbon Monoxide brina awareness poisoning as Stacey had tragically lost her son. This was a performance very close to our hearts. The troupe have also had a great bit of coverage on television over the years, we have performed on the BBC for Graham Norton's 'When will I be famous' show, appeared on Simon Cowells ITV Britain's Got Talent and most recently the troupe were featured on the BBC's programme 'Our Dancing Town'.

Huddersfield Crusaders have become apart of the local community over the past 25 years and although we do not have as many members at present we will continue to do what we do and provide a unique dance activity for young people in our area and those surrounding. CONFLICT RESOLUTIONS

The Conflict Resolutions initiative was launched in January 2017. Since it's conception the demand has exceeded all levels of expectation and the impact has been extremely positive.

The Conflict Resolution programme was set up to address issues in the Community amongst our young people, issues that are happening throughout the Country.

One of our ethos is early intervention, whereby we address and tackle these issues from a young age. We go into the Schools throughout Kirklees, engaging with the pupils on a variety of topics that affect them directly. Topics covered include – Gang Issues, Postcode Wars, Social Media Awareness, Respect/Attitude Issues, Social/Life Skills, Cultural Diversity Awareness, Youth Crime and Education.

The feedback we have received from both pupils and the teachers has been really encouraging and many of the Schools we have worked in have asked us to come back to deliver more Workshops both in the Classes and the Assembly's.

We also go into the Community and Youth Clubs mentoring young people, changing their mindsets from a negative one to a positive one, instilling in these young people that they have the potential to achieve anything in life.

We won a Community Award at the recent Ashbrow Awards for best Community group of the year 2018 which was a fantastic achievement and shows us that

the work we are doing is recognised and appreciated.

We have also been nominated for a National Award for the work we are doing, we will know later down in the summer, so watch this space as they say.

The Ashbrow Ward & Birkby Community Hub



During her many years as a councillor, Jean has helped thousands of our local residents with individual personal problems and issues. She has been involved in many local groups and organisations including school Governing Bodies and succeeded in bringing considerable investment into the ward.

HOUSEHOLD ENQUIRY FORM

DON'T bin your Household Enquiry Form – here's why

From the 17th July 2018 we will be sending out the Household Enquiry Forms to all homes in Kirklees.

Even if nothing has changed you **DO** need to respond. It's easy enough to let us know – you can do it online, by telephone, by text message or by post.

If you don't respond you may not be able to vote in elections. It may also affect your chances of getting a mobile phone contract, a mortgage or even opening a bank account.

If there is anyone over 16 in the household who is not on the form, let us know, so that they won't be missing out!

Individual Electoral Registration means that every individual is personally responsible for being on the electoral register. Government rules mean you could be fined

£1,000 if you don't respond.



CARE NAVIGATION

The Care Navigation team at Kirklees Council helps adults with social care needs, or their carers, find health and social care support in their communities.

Care Navigators have their own areas to work in so have a good local knowledge of what's available in communities, such as lunch clubs, social groups, exercise groups and support groups. They work with people to help them find support with their day to day lives including equipment, shopping, transport and cleaning. They can support people to find organisations that can advise on debt problems, benefits and housing, and more!

Care Navigators can help people to build a support package that is tailored to their needs. Support can come from health care providers, sports and leisure facilities or from voluntary and community groups. They can help people find free or alternative support, as well as care services for people who have a budget to spend.

Care Navigators can support people and their carers who have had an assessment of their needs, who are eligible for a personal budget, to arrange their own personalised support to enhance the quality of their lives. They can also help people decide how they want to spend their personal budget, if they would like Kirklees to provide their support, or if a direct payment would suit them better. Direct payments would allow them to choose their own provider or maybe employ a personal assistant. The team can provide the same advice and support to help people who decide not to have an assessment and want to pay for their own support to arrange the support that they want, using their specialised knowledge of what is available.


