STAYWELL THIS WINTER

Here are some tips to stay warm and well as winter approaches...

- Draw your curtains at dusk and keep your doors closed to block out draughts.
- Have regular hot drinks and eat at least one hot meal a day if possible—eating regularly helps keep energy levels up during winter.
- Wrap up warm—wear several light layers of warm clothes and shoes with a good grip if you go out on cold days.
- Keep as active in your home as possible.
- If you have reduced mobility or a health condition such as heart or lung disease, you should heat your home to at least 18 degrees Celsius. (Be sure to get your boiler serviced as needed) and make sure you wear enough clothes to stay warm. It's a good idea to keep your bedroom at this temperature all night.
- Stock up on any medicines you may need and have a good store of tinned, dry or frozen foods.
- Seek help from a pharmacist if unwell, quickly. Before it gets more serious, even if its just a cough or a cold.
 - Have a list of emergency numbers, including Kirklees emergency adverse weather number - 01484 414888 - for local people in need of emergency help due to bad weather.
 - Contact your doctor for a free flu vaccination if you have a child aged 2 to 4 years old, are pregnant, under 65 but at risk due to a particular health condition, or over 65.
- Look out for vulnerable people or elderly relatives and neighbours - you could shop online for them, or clear snow from their paths and drives.



DEIGHTON CARNIVAL

Carnivals, festivals, fetes, galas and family fun days have been happening in the Deighton and Brackenhall area throughout the 1950's and 60's.

The Deighton carnival as we know it today, first took place in August 2002 at the Deighton Centre in Huddersfield. The vision coming from the D.B.I (Deighton and Brackenhall Initiative)

The theme for the first event was 'DEIGHTON BY THE SEA' and it took place on the front car park. Although on a very small scale the event was very well attended.

After the success of the first event, the community demanded this to be an annual event. The last Saturday in June was set as the official date for the event and this became a permanent fixture on the Kirklees summer events diary.

Planning soon got underway for the 2003 carnival and over the years the event grew in size and quality, each year having a different theme and celebrating the diversity of the area.

Royal Mail delivery cards

Beware of missed delivery cards which look like they've been delivered by Royal Mail. On the run up to Christmas, we are ordering more items online, consider if you are actually expecting a delivery. The cards are almost identical to the official Royal Mail card, except that the Royal Mail logo is missing. A 0208 number is provided to arrange collection which is a premium rate number with calls costing £45.

DOORS LOCKED

The nights are drawing in and the clocks will soon go back. Keep yourselves safe on your doorstep from opportunist and distraction criminals by following our top tips:

- ☐ Only answer the door to someone you are expecting
- ☐ Use peepholes or where possible, check through windows to see who is at the door.
- ☐ ALWAYS use the door chain when answering the door to any caller.
- ☐ Check identification details by telephoning the genuine telephone number from the telephone book or web-site, NOT the telephone number on the ID card.
- ☐ Keep all doors and windows locked.
- □ NEVER let anyone in your home un-less it is someone you know and trust.
- ☐ Consider having outside lights fitted to give a better view of anyone who may be on your doorstep.

DOORSTEP CALLERS

WARNING - Money Expert doorstep callers

Their has been recent reports of residents receiving unsolicited visits from representatives of a company called Money Expert attempting to sell various energy products by using Martin Lewis' name in an attempt to fool people into believing they are from the reputable Money Saving Expert.com.

Money Saving Expert have confirmed that they NEVER engage in cold calling and these callers are from other companies making false claims. Martin Lewis advises if you are thinking of changing energy providers to do a full market comparison and not to do business with someone at your door.

TPS PROTECT

The TPS Protect app screens your smartphone against nuisance or scam calls, helping you to

decide whether to answer or block suspicious calls. For numbers you don't want to receive, add them to your personal block list and forget about them. For calls you definitely want to receive, add those numbers to your approved list so you never miss them.

Can Care Navigation make a difference for you?

The Care Navigation team at Kirklees Council helps adults with social care needs, or their carers, find health and social care support in their communities.

Care Navigators have their own areas to work in so have a good local knowledge of what's available in communities, such as lunch clubs, social groups, exercise groups and support groups. They work with people to help them find support with their day to day lives including equipment, shopping, transport and cleaning. They can support people to find organisations that can advise on debt problems, benefits and housing, and more!

Care Navigators can help people to build a support package that is tailored to their needs. Support can come from health care providers, sports and leisure facilities or from voluntary and community groups. They can help people find free or alternative support, as well as care services for people who have a budget to spend.

Care Navigators can support people and their carers who have had an assessment of their needs, who are eligible for a personal budget, to arrange their own personalised support to enhance the quality of their lives. They can also help people decide how they want to spend their personal budget, if they would like Kirklees to provide their support, or if a direct payment would suit them better. Direct payments would allow them to choose their own provider or maybe employ a personal assistant. The team can provide the same advice and support to help people who decide not to have an assessment and want to pay for their own support to arrange the support that they want, using their specialised knowledge of what is available.
