

The event was hailed a huge success by over two hundred visitors who thoroughly enjoyed the entertainment and activities on offer.



LS2Y – Hi guys, thank you for meeting with us today. Can you tell us a little bit about what it is that you do, how it all came about and why?

Conflict resolutions

We had all been discussing these issues and what we could do to try and make a difference for over a year now. The fact that we have all grown up in the same urban community and now all have children of our own has given us the passion and drive to try to armour our youth against the many different factors that are very much present today.

Our children are like sponges, they do what they see, repeat what they hear so we as an elder generation have to come together to make a change and step up. Teachers generally do not live in the area they work in so it is only natural that they will not be able to understand an individual's attitude. It is not necessarily Education of peers but that of experience of our environment and cultural awareness that are key to enable change.

Crime, anti-social behaviour, social media and peer pressure to name a few, are all huge common denominators that pave our path and like many different communities worldwide, our youth become unconsciously victim of this "Breakable" cycle.

Violence, fists and weapons are no match to Education, Books and Words and we want to give our youth the belief and empowerment they deserve to go and achieve exactly what they want to in life.

Yes you can be a Doctor, Yes you can be a Lawyer and Yes you can still be **YOU** and achieve these things.

We have had the opportunity to bring this focus to quite a few schools now and we are taken a back just how well it has been received. The fact that we are from where the children are from, and have experienced probably what they are now experiencing enables us to really invest and empathise with their whole being. This was highly recognised by the teachers also.

Our sessions last around an hour each and without talking at them we engage with them through role play. A very touching moment was when during one of our role play's a student actually opened up and shared with us that they had gone through the same thing and they wished they had known what conflict resolutions had taught them at the time.

The dangers of Social Media and Cyberbullying/Abuse are also high on our agendas. We have to remember that technology is always going to be here, so it is important that we educate them about the dangers and also make it clear that we can use these things in a controlled manner so as to not be controlled.

The conflict resolution workshop was excellent. The presenters were an obvious team with priceless "real world" experience. The children warmed to them instantly and were captivated.

Who we are?

Friends of Bradley Park is a local charity formed in August 2016 as a coming together of local community groups including Bradley Tenants & Residents Association, St Thomas School, Bradley Out of School Club, Bradley Brownies, Chestnut Family Forum, various local individuals and supported by Ashbrow Partnering Together.

What are we doing?

Our charitable aims are to provide or assist in the provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time activities through the improvement of Bradley Park.

How?


Our main project is to replace the existing wooden changing facility, which had been on Bradley Park for a number of years. This was seriously damaged by an arson attack in 2014 resulting in the council having to demolish the remains of the building. Following the blaze Kirklees Council said it could not replace the facilities but after pressure from local councillors and the Bradley TRA and with support from Ashbrow Partnering Together a deal was done to investigate handing over the whole site to community volunteers.

Why?

Friends of Bradley Park decided that the site could not be left to fall into disrepair with the loss of a very valuable local civic amenity and set about looking at the potential options and opportunities for the site. We have secured substantial funding for the new building and planning permission is going to be submitted shortly. As part of the funding agreement with Kirklees Council FOBP charity volunteers will take over and run the entire park for the next 125 years in what we believe is a UK first for a park of this size (approximately 5.76 hectares, 15 acres). The Bradley TRA, Bradley Brownies and Bradley Out of School Club will be first groups to move into the new building as part of the funding agreement.

The New Building

- Is a 395 sq metre modular community building
- It includes extensive changing facilities, activity/function hall, kitchen, storage, office and a multifunctional meeting space/room. External facilities proposed include junior and senior football pitches, with aspirations for further improvements including a multi-use games area (MUGA) court, enhanced fixed play area and a 3g or 4g indoor facility in the future.
- Will be hired to local groups to fund maintenance and improvement of Bradley Park and its facilities.
- Currently expected to open in August 2017 (The layout of the new building)



A formal asset transfer application was submitted to Kirklees council in November Planning application will be submitted early in March



Cabinet decision is due in March 2017



Building work will begin in June 2017 and the new building will be open in August 2017 at this time FOBP will be responsible for the whole 15 acre site.

Free childcare sessions at a high quality early learning provider can make a real difference to your child's future. Research shows that children who go to learning sessions from the age of two are more confident, learn quicker, and have better language skills. They also have a head start at school and continue to achieve, as they grow older.

Your child could be eligible for a free childcare place, for up to 15 hours a week for 38 weeks of the year (school term time). You may also be able to take your hours over the school holidays.

Who can have a free place?

Parents of a 2 year old who get one or more of the following benefits:

- Child Tax Credit and/or Working Tax Credit. Your annual household income must be less than £16,191 (as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue & Custams)
- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit

Parents of a 2 year old child that:

- Receives Disability Living Allowance
- Has an Education, Health & Care plan
- Is 'Looked After' by the Local Authority, or has left care through a Special Guardianship order, Child Arrangements order, or Adoption
- Has a Child Protection or Child in Need plan

When can my child start their free place?

If your child's 2 nd birthday falls between:	Your child can start from the:
1 January - 31 March	Summer term (beginning on or after 1 April)
1 April - 31 August	Autumn term (beginning an ar after 1 September)
1 September - 31 December	Spring term (beginning on or after 1 January)

DEIGHTON INTO SPORT PROJECT: ENABLING YOUNG PEOPLE TO PARTICIPATE!

Deighton Into Sport Project continues to be a strong contributor to the life of this Community, using sport as a means of bringing people together, integrating new members of our Community, and enabling our young people to keep fit and become well-adjusted.

- We are particularly proud of the way in which some of our young people who have been with the Project since its early days, have taken over coaching and mentoring responsibilities with the younger members of our Football, Basketball, Netball and Dance Clubs...
- We have continued to provide a range of sporting opportunities to the young people of our neighbourhood and encouraged integration by continuing to welcome into our club newly settled members of the community, some from other parts of the UK, some seeking asylum in this country from troubled areas of the world, and economic migrants from parts of Eastern Europe.
- The future of our Project continues to be entirely dependent on our being able to obtain the financial support we need to be able to meet our obligations. We are grateful for all the support we have received in the past year, especially from Sport England Streetgames, Community Sport Activation Fund and Kirklees Council, Kirklees Neighbourhood Housing and the One Community Foundation.
- We look forward to a fruitful partnership with the Ashbrow Partnering Together Initiative, which has now been set up to undertake further development work in the Ashbrow Ward.
- We are providing sport and fitness opportunities for over 350 children and young people every week. Well over 15,000 individual attendances every year.
- This Football Season 2016-17 saw us begin with 2x Under 8's, and Under 9's, 10's, 11's, 12's and 14's. We have well over 120 playing members of our Club, Deighton Juniors FC.



Our Open Access Saturday Morning Football'Skills' Club provides coaching for children and young people from the ages of 5 to 17.

We have also set up 2x Open Age teams, made up of young men from the neighbourhood, some of whom had played with our Junior teams but had stopped playing at the age of 16. They are now in Division 4 and Division 4 of the Reserve League of the Huddersfield & District Association,

- We were also delighted to welcome a Women's Football Team from Clifton Rangers, who are playing regular League football with twenty playing members. Clifton Rangers also have two Open Age Men's Teams in the Heavy Woollen District League. They are now affiliated to our Project and play their home games at Deighton. We also have another football team from one of the local Churches, AFC Huddersfield, who are also affiliated to our Project and play their games here at Deighton.
- We now have Under 16's and U13's Basketball Teams who
 play in the Central Venues' League Competitions, one
 hosted by our Club here at the Deighton Arena, and are
 working towards other junior teams when we have the
 appropriate numbers.
- We still have a Men's Basketball Team, and a Women's Basketball Team. They play successfully in the Leeds and District Basketball Leagues.
- We have recently been awarded a grant from Sport England to run Basketball Coaching sessions at our local High School, The North Huddersfield Trust School. It is our intention to inspire young people to start playing basketball, and expect an increase in our numbers as a result of this.

COMMUNITYNEWS

IN BRIEF

Children's Centres & Youth Clubs

The Council have recently concluded the review of services to children and young people and a decision has been taken to make massive changes to council run provision which will see the closure of all but 4 Children's Centres across Kirklees and the closure of almost all open access youth provision. The good news for Ashbrow is that our Children's Centre will remain open. However, it will deliver services very differently and will also be the Children's Centre for the whole of Huddersfield. More detail will be published once known.

The Council have also decided to close all local open access youth provision. The majority of local provision had closed over recent years and now the remaining Council run youth club at Deighton Arena on Thursdays will close. Originally it was due to close at the end of March but this has been delayed until the summer of 2017.

Fartown Post Office

The Post Office are proposing to relocate Fartown Post Office from Fartown Green Road to new premises on Bradford Road. Specific details and a date have not yet been published. The move is expected in May/ June and if it goes ahead will mean longer opening hours and more services available.



Fartown Village Hall

In December 2016, the Council closed Fartown Village Hall as it was deemed to be potentially dangerous due to a number of significant repairs the building required. In January 2017, Local Services 2 You submitted a Business Case to asset transfer the building into community ownership. At the same time applications for the capital funding to renovate the building have been submitted. Unfortunately, the Council have now said the process of asset transfer consideration will be delayed due to another organisation expressing an interest. It is hoped that a speedy resolution can be found so the building does not fall into further dereliction and. importantly, can be open again as a resource for the community of Fartown.

Chestnut Library & Information Centre (LIC)

Chestnut LIC is in the process of moving into new space within the Chestnut Centre. The relocation and downsizing of the LIC, is due to the original cuts in the Council budgets for supporting LIC's. Unfortunately, at this point we only have limited funding guaranteed until the end of March 2018. The Council have announced further cuts in Library funding in the future and this may well impact on the Chestnut Centre provision. Ashbrow Partnering Together, Local Services 2 You and the ward councillors are all working hard to try and maintain a service at the Chestnut Centre as they understand the importance of this facility for the local community.





Fartown affordable homes taking shape



Thirteen family-sized houses are taking shape in Sadeh-Lok's latest affordable homes development.

Contractors for the Huddersfield-based housing group - part of the Incommunities Group - are building a mix of two and three bedroom properties for rent at Aguamarine Drive.

The site, formerly a disused goods yard, was assembled by Incommunities' in-house development team and is only a short distance from the centre of Fartown.

Each property is being fitted with energy efficient central heating systems and fitted kitchen and bathrooms and landscaped gardens.

The £1.3 million development is being supported by the Homes and Communities Agency.

Hussain Brook, Head of Sadeh Lok said: "I'm delighted to see great progress being made on this development which will deliver more social rental homes for local people."

"Sadeh Lok is committed to regenerating brownfield sites like this and working with our partners -Incommunities, Kirklees Council and the Homes and Communities Agency – who share our vision to improve social housing provision in the area."

Cllr Naheed Mather, Cabinet Member for Housing at Kirklees Council, said: "I am delighted to see the work on this new housing development get underway. Working with partners to develop new

homes is essential to securing affordable

housing for the future.

"The Council, Sadeh Lok, and Incommunities have worked hard to ensure this scheme goes ahead. The new development has been designed in a way that not only secures access for cyclists and pedestrians using the adjacent greenway, but also creates a quality development for new residents.

"I look forward to seeing the scheme progressing over the coming months."

The new homes are due to be completed in September 2017.

Can Care Navigation make a difference for you?

The Care Navigation team at Kirklees Council helps adults with social care needs, or their carers, find health and social care support in their communities.

Care Navigators have their own areas to work in so have a good local knowledge of what's available in communities, such as lunch clubs, social groups, exercise groups and support groups. They work with people to help them find support with their day to day lives including equipment, shopping, transport and cleaning. They can support people to find organisations that can advise on debt problems, benefits and housing, and more!

Care Navigators can help people to build a support package that is tailored to their needs. Support can come from health care providers, sports and leisure facilities or from voluntary and community groups. They can help people find free or alternative support, as well as care services for people who have a budget to spend.

Care Navigators can support people and their carers who have had an assessment of their needs, who are eligible for a personal budget, to arrange their own personalised support to enhance the quality of their lives. They can also help people decide how they want to spend their personal budget, if they would like Kirklees to provide their support, or if a direct payment would suit them better. Direct payments would allow them to choose their own provider or maybe employ a personal assistant. The team can provide the same advice and support to help people who decide not to have an assessment and want to pay for their own support to arrange the support that they want, using their specialised knowledge of what is available.
